

These physicians and treatment facilities understand how to manage occupational injury cases to maximize your recovery, and how to coordinate insurance coverage.

➔ Important! ➔

Your claim may be denied by the insurance carrier if you fail to use proper procedures – including reporting the injury promptly.

If you are a JLab staff member, when you return to work after a physician referral...

1. Check in with Occupational Medicine. If the treating physician gave you a return-to-work note or similar paperwork, show it to the nurse.

2. Occupational Medicine staff will coordinate any work restrictions with your supervisor. This protects you from aggravating your injury or delaying your recuperation.

3. Comply with any activity limitations the physician may have stated – at home and at work.

4. Check back with the Occupational Medicine as scheduled and after any follow-up visit to the off-site physician or other treatment facility.

5. Call Occupational Medicine if you have any problems: with your injury, with treatment, or if you receive bills for your treatment.

Is this during JLab's normal

business hours?
(8:00 AM to 5:00 PM)

- ◆ If so, call or go to JLab Occupational Medicine (269-7539). Occupational Medicine staff will provide first aid and determine if you need additional care. They will come to your location if you are unable to get to the clinic.
- ◆ If the number is busy, page Occ. Med. (584-7539 or 584-5585) and enter the number of your phone. Stay at the phone; a staff member will call back promptly.

Is this is outside of normal working hours?

- ◆ Go to the nearest emergency medical facility. Tell them that you work at JLab, and this is work related. JLab's designated physician referral panel is listed in this pamphlet. Use one of them during their open hours.
 - ◆ Do not go to your personal physician. It is very likely you will have to pay the bills if you do.
 - ◆ As soon as you are able, contact Occupational Medicine.
- No matter what time of the day, if this is a serious injury (profuse bleeding, electrical shock, head injury, loss of consciousness, etc.), call 911 right away! Then call Occupational Medicine. Call 5822 to alert our on-site emergency response actions.
- As soon as possible, notify your supervisor of your situation.
